Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for December

Crime

There were ninety six crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area in November. Of these, the following have occurred.

Residential Burglary:

During the evening of 3rd November a male knocked on the door of a property on Ainsworth Road. When answered, the male stated he was destitute and wanted to be let in. When refused, the male attempted to force his way in, but was repelled by the homeowner. The male made off. He was later arrested for attempted burglary.

Around lunchtime on 10th November, damage was caused to a front door panel and beading after an attempt was made to force entry.

Overnight 13th & 14th November a garage at a property on Chestnut Avenue was broken into after the door was forced open. It is unknown if anything has been stolen.

Vehicle Crime: A secure motorbike was stolen from the Little London Farm Shop on 13th November.

A vehicle was taken without the owner's consent by a family member from a house on Stallingborough Road.

Criminal Damage:

Two vehicles were damaged at St Margarets Crescent, Habrough. Damage to a vehicle whilst being driven due to a road rage incident.

Tyres slashed on a car at Kinloch Way.

Damage to a car number plate after attempts to remove it resulted in the plate being snapped.

A brick was thrown through a window at Somerton Road. A stone thrown at a house window at Talbot Road caused the window to shatter.

Other crime include:

A small amount of herbal cannabis was found on a driver who had been stopped for other matters on Keelby Road, Stallingborough. Theft of a generator and metal building equipment from a business on Middleplatt Road.

A trailer containing pallets of toys and hair products was stolen from a compound on Manby Road Industrial Estate after an angle grinder was used to gain entry. The trailer was hooked up to a truck and driven away from the compound. The trailer was recovered nearby having been emptied of its load.

Entry was forced into a compound on Stallingborough Industrial Estate. A trailer loaded with high value furniture was stolen Twenty six minor assaults.

Sixteen reports of harassment.

Two reports of making malicious communications.

Ten reports of minor public order.

Three shop thefts.

Two making off without payment for fuel from Bluestone Service Station.

There have been three incidents of ASB reported. Youths being abusive to a female walking from Eastfield School.
