Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for March

Crime

There were sixty seven crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area in February. Of these, the following have occurred.

Residential Burglary:

During the early hours of 1st February an attempt was made to enter a garage of Hadleigh Road. Nothing was stolen but the door was damaged.

Overnight 4th & 5th February a caravan parked at Sunningdale Drive was broken into. Nothing was stolen.

Between 10th & 14th February an attempt was made to enter a detached garage at a property on Pamela Road by removing roof tiles. No entry was made.

Overnight 26th & 27th February, a new build house on Roxton Lane was entered. Copper piping and cables were stolen.

Commercial Burglary:

During the early hours of 1st February intruders forced entry to the Habrough Country Hotel. Copper was stolen.

Between 10th & 13th February intruders forced entry to the grounds of a chemical factory at Stallingborough after cutting the perimeter fence. Locks were ground off on three brick buildings

and earthing wire was stolen. Another part of the complex was approached with other buildings being entered and property stolen.

Vehicle Crime:

During 26th February three persons were arrested following a road traffic collision after taking a car belonging to a family member without permission.

Criminal Damage:

Wires to CCTV cameras were cut following an incident where travellers attended a site on Stallingborough Industrial Estate. Damage to a house window on Bluestone Lane.

Damage to palisade fencing of a compound on Immingham Dock.

Other crime include:

On two occasions thieves targeted the same business on Immingham Dock. On the first occasion they stole various items including metals.

The next day they used a forklift to lift a generator on to their vehicle before leaving the site.

On another occasion a different company was targeted on the dock. This time, plant machinery was stolen.

Four shop thefts.

Two making of without payment for fuel.

Twelve assaults.

Ten reports of harassment.

Five reports of sending malicious communications.

Eight minor public order incidents.

There have been two incidents of ASB reported. Youths throwing objects at houses Hadleigh Road and Waterworks Street.
