Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for May

Crime

There were ninety six crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area in April. Of these, the following have occurred.

Residential Burglary:

During the early hours of 9th April, an attempt was made to force entry into a shed in a garden on Carisbroke Walk. The intruder was disturbed by the occupier and left the are without gaining entry.

And around the same time, an attempt was made to enter a caravan in a garden on Pilgrim Avenue. Again, no entry was made.

Commercial Burglary:

During the early hours of 1st April, burglars forced entry to Home Bargains by smashing a front window. Several e-cigarettes were stolen.

During the evening of 3rd April, Whilst the Oasis Academy were hosting a community event, a group of youths entered parts of the school closed to the public. The youths caused damage, forced entry to locked rooms as well as stealing property. These youths have been identified and are being dealt with.

Vehicle Crime:

Between 6th & 11th April, number plates were stolen from a car parked in the compound of the Imperial Ford garage on Stallingborough Road.

Overnight 10th & 11th April a moped was stolen from the front garden of a home on Ings Lane.

During the afternoon of 16th April, an attempt was made to steel a motorbike on Atwood Close. The thief was disturbed by the owner and made off on another motorbike.

Overnight 19th & 20th April, a motorbike was stolen from a garden on Somerton Road.

During the early hours of 24th April, a male was in a front garden on Aire Close, looking at the security of a motorbike parked there. The occupants shouted at the male who ran off.

Criminal Damage:

Damage to a van on Homestead Park caused by youths jumping on the vehicle.

Damage caused to a van parked on Beechwood Avenue.

House window smashed on Cravens Lane.

CCTV cameras damages at Mauxhall Farm.

Damage to fencing at Worsley Road.

Damage to foodstuffs at a store on Kennedy Way.

Other crime include:

Theft of scaffolding from a site on North Moss Lane.

Thirteen shop thefts.

One make off without payment for fuel.

Twenty two assaults.

Seven reports of harassment.

Four reports of sending malicious communications.

Twenty three minor public order incidents.

There have been eleven incidents of ASB reported.
