#### Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for November

#### Crime

There were ninety nine crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area in October. Of these, the following have occurred.

#### Residential Burglary:

During the early hours of 9<sup>th</sup> October, offenders attended a property on Station Road Habrough. A vehicle window was smashed. And the detached garage was entered. Power tools were stolen.

#### Business & commercial Burglary:

On 15<sup>th</sup> October, two males and a female enter Sainsbury's on Pelham Road. Whilst the female distracts the member of staff, the males lean over the counter and steal lottery scratch cards. Between 12<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup> October, an attempt was made to enter a building on Homestead Park use by the Charity 'Men in Sheds'. No entry was gained.

Overnight 12<sup>th</sup> & 22<sup>nd</sup> October, an attempt was made to force the door handle on a shop on Kennedy way. Damage was caused but no entry gained.

The following night, another attempt was made to enter the same store by the same means. Again, no entry was gained.

#### NOT PROTECTIVELY MARKED

Vehicle Crime: During the evening of 21<sup>st</sup> October, an insecure car parked on Heale Road was entered. Property was stolen.

During the early hours of 31<sup>st</sup> October, fuel to the value of about £500 was stolen from a truck parked in a layby on the A180.

#### **Criminal Damage:**

Arson to a derelict building on the old golf course.

Theft of a fuel bowser from a compound on Queens Road.

Twenty one assaults.

Eighteen reports of harassment.

Three reports of making malicious communications.

Eight reports of minor public order.

Four shop thefts.

There have been eight incidents of ASB reported.

Jackson Mews reporting loud music from a neighbouring street.

Two reports of youths causing issues on Kennedy way.

Youths causing issues at Homestead Park.

Youths throwing objects at a home on Lulworth Walk.

Three neighbour disputes.
