Immingham Habrough & Stallingborough Report for October

Crime

There were eighty four crimes recorded for the Immingham, Habrough and Stallingborough ward area in September. Of these, the following have occurred.

Residential Burglary:

Overnight 2nd & 3rd September a lock was forced on the rear door of a property on Birkdale. Property including clothing was stolen.

Business & commercial Burglary:

Overnight 7th & 8th September storage containers at a compound on Beels Road Stallingborough Industrial Estate were entered after the locks were ground off. Clothing was stolen.

On the night of 10th September intruders went to another premises on Beels Road where they pulled a cctv camera off the wall and forced entry to the warehouse. The cctv hard drive was stolen.

Vehicle Crime:

During the early hours of 6th September a motorbike parked in the rear garden of a house on Kings Road was stolen.

During the evening of 20th September, a motorbike was stolen from outside Sainsbury's on Pelham Road. It was later set alight at the rear of Clyfton Crescent.

On the same evening, thieves entered a compound on the Stallingborough Industrial Estate where they are seen on CCTV to slice open the curtain sides of eight trailers and look inside. The thieves left empty handed.

Around lunch time on 23rd September an attempt was made to steal a secure motorbike from outside a store on Kennedy Way. The thieves were disturbed by the owner. The thieves dropped the motorbike, causing damage to it, before making off on another motorbike.

Criminal Damage:

Arson to the stolen motorbike as already mentioned.

Damage to a new build property on South Marsh Road, Stallingborough.

Damage to windows at a property on Manby Road.

Damage to paving slabs on Kennedy Way. One domestic related criminal damage.

Other crime include:

Twenty one assaults.

Eight minor public order offences.

Eighteen reports of harassment.

Four reports of making malicious communications.

Three making off without payment for fuel.

Three shop thefts.

There have been four incidents of ASB reported.

Two of these were in relation to the use of illegal motorbikes.

Youths playing 'Knock door run' on Lydford Road.

Youths causing issues to residents on Lulworth Walk.
